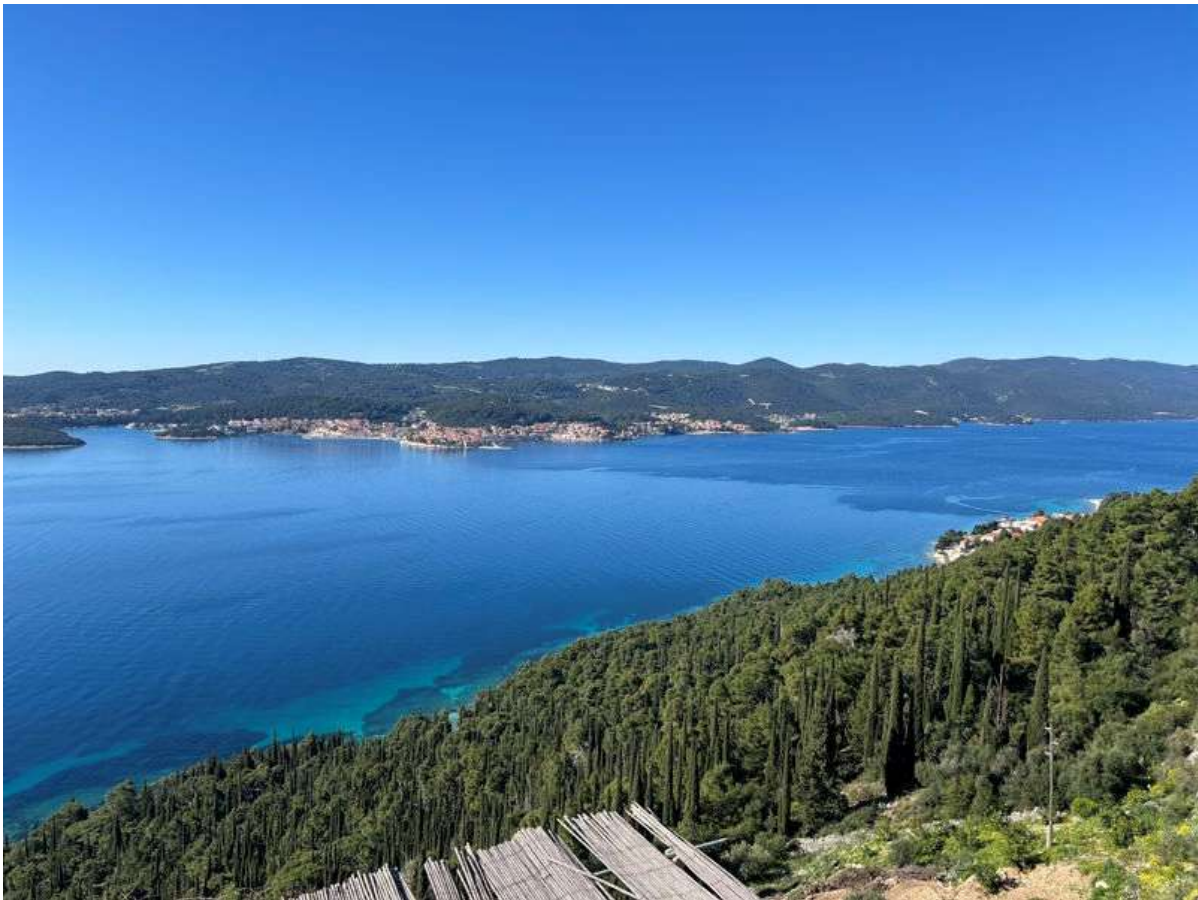

What Makes Pelješac So Special?

Pelješac is Croatia's second-largest peninsula, stretching 65 kilometers into the Adriatic Sea. This narrow strip of land connects the mainland to a world of contrasts: rugged mountains meet gentle vineyards, medieval towns overlook secluded bays, and centuries-old traditions blend with warm hospitality.

Location and Getting to Pelješac

The **Pelješac Peninsula** is located in southern Dalmatia, approximately 60 kilometers northwest of Dubrovnik. Since the opening of the spectacular Pelješac Bridge in 2022, the peninsula is even easier to reach—without the detour through Bosnian territory.

How to Get There:

- By car from Dubrovnik: approx. 1 hour
- From Split: approx. 2.5 hours
- Ferry connections to Korčula from Orebić
- Nearest airport: Dubrovnik (60 km)

The Most Beautiful Places on Pelješac Orebić – Gateway to Korčula Island



Orebić Croatia is the tourist heart of Pelješac, picturesquely nestled at the foot of Mount Sveti Ilija (961 m). This charming coastal town offers:

Prapatno BeachOne of Pelješac's most beautiful bays with fine pebbles, turquoise water, and a campsite. Ideal for snorkelers.

Divna BeachHidden pebble beach in a sheltered cove—perfect for those seeking tranquility.

Viganj BeachHotspot for windsurfers and kitesurfers thanks to the Maestral wind.

Pelješac Wine: Croatia's Wine Paradise

Pelješac is **the wine region** of Croatia. The peninsula is renowned for its indigenous grape varieties and exceptional red wines.

The Wine Regions of Pelješac

Dingač and Postup are the peninsula's two protected wine-growing areas (DOC). The steep, sun-drenched slopes on the southern shore produce powerful, full-bodied red wines.

The Main Grape Varieties:

- **Plavac Mali:** The queen of Croatian red wines, related to Zinfandel
- **Dingač:** Legendary red wine from the eponymous vineyard
- **Postup:** Elegant, structured red wine
- **Pošip:** Popular white wine from Korčula, also grown on Pelješac

Salt Pans of Ston Europe's oldest active salt pans—salt has been harvested here for over 4,000 years.

Nature Experiences

Mount Sveti Ilija (961 m) The peninsula's highest peak offers breathtaking panoramas over the Adriatic, Korčula, and the mainland. Hiking trails wind through fragrant Mediterranean scrub.

Arboretum Trsteno One of Europe's oldest botanical gardens, just a short drive from Pelješac.
